



Global Partnership sets forth between the International School of Brussels and greenlight for girls

Brussels, 26 June 2013: In the chateau administration building on the school's campus, a global partnership was signed today with International School of Brussels, a leader in international education, and greenlight for girls, an international non-profit organisation headquartered in Brussels and operating world-wide. With both ISB and g4g teams present to commemorate the official partnership, the organisations set forth plans to work on projects to support each other for their mutual missions and objectives.

"The story of greenlight for girls began with ISB three years ago," explains Melissa Rancourt, g4g Founder and Chairman. "Our very first event was on the ISB campus in which 200 girls from all over Brussels and nearby cities came together to have a fun-filled day of science workshops. The success of the day was due to ISB's amazing support, encouragement and beautiful environment. This gave us the confidence to create our events world-wide."

In today's signing ceremony, ISB's Director, Kevin Bartlett emphasised, "The partnership with greenlight for girls is a really important one for us. We choose our partners carefully, and only work with those who share our beliefs and values. In this case, it's a perfect fit. Maths, science and technology are key learning areas for us, and equity of access is the underpinning thread throughout our mission. It's a pleasure to partner with another non-profit driven with a passion for learning, inclusion and equity."

Both organisations will now be working together on upcoming programmes and new innovative learning ideas that can benefit others in other parts of the world. Joint activities include exploring Afterschool Coding Programmes and hands-on science activities in the classroom for girls and boys given by role model STEM professionals.

In addition, both organisations are gearing up for what is now the **fourth** greenlight for girls day in Brussels, an event that continues to grow, improve and gain interest from the community. David Willows, Director of External Relations, mentions, "the greenlight for girls day will take place in our new high school premises this year. The school is looking forward to working with the g4g team on creative ways to use our new learning labs, the forest classroom and new amphitheatre for their workshops."

"The greenlight for girls day in Brussels will take place on Saturday, November 16th so now is the time to mark your calendar," says Melissa. "We're always so thrilled at the anticipation of
